School Counseling Practicum and Internship Plans for Offsite Hours

Create useful documents or resources (that you or your site can use in the future)

- Individual and group counseling session plans
- Large group developmental counseling curriculum
- Prevention curriculum
- Workshop plans on relevant topics (e.g. digital citizenship, risks associated with vaping, student voice projects)
- Information brochures on timely topics and issues (e.g., bullying, COVID-19, study skills)
- Slides to be used at Family/Parent/Caregiver Night on a given topic (e.g. middle school, high school, and college transitions, achievement pressure, substance use, first gen college students, self-esteem, etc.)
- Webinar or slides or curriculum on college admissions (generally or in relation to school closings, etc)
- Materials to be used for professional development (e.g. self-care, cultural humility, writing letters of recommendation, mindfulness)
- Create a resource for schools to use while closed (i.e. how COVID-19 is impacting colleges admissions and planning)
- Curriculum on mental health literacy
- Book list for parents (parents need this!!! i.e. "Good books for supporting your child (e.g. boys' or girls' development, supporting your LGBTQIA+ child")
- Book list for teachers (e.g. books that portray counter narratives of students of color or illustrate key developmental issues)
- Compile a bibliotherapy list for a particular topic (ie, bullying, self-esteem, divorce, etc.)
- Video blogs on timely/relevant topics (these could be shared with parents/caregivers or with students) even blogs or vlogs conducting a core curriculum lesson (displays how you would deliver lessons to your students if you were ever in this position as a school counselor).
- Develop a needs assessment for a given group or student population (e.g. school engagement or school climate)
- Draft letters to policy makers (professional advocacy)

- Develop a conference proposal targeting specific constituency & issue
- Develop a crisis plan (e.g., school violence, unexpected death of teacher, pandemic, and etc.)
- Develop a resource list for students (i.e. scholarships, social service agencies, places to get help for a particular issue)

- Research an issue or topic that will support some piece of work at the school and offer a one-page guide on key issues and best practices for staff
- Research potential grant opportunities for your school and develop a list of them for your site
- Create a directory of scholarships / databases
- Write for a small grant (lots of foundations offer small grants to educators)
- If multilingual create bilingual resources
- Review school level policies with suggestions and recommendations where appropriate (e.g. safety policies, use of social media, discipline policies, utilization of technology, mandated reporting)
- Research (and maybe teleconference) various service providers available to your site/student population and create a resource map and/or develop a list of resources for site with services offered
- Create a brief video (2-4 minutes) explaining "what is the role of a school counselor specifically at your school level); Could also create an infographic

Create useful documents or resources needed now during virtual school

- Research local organizations and agencies providing support/food to ensure students with food insecurities have access to food or other needs met.
- Research and write up plans for students' re-entry to schools after natural disasters, etc.
- Create webinar or slides regarding how colleges are responding to school closures/university changes related to COVID 19

Consider Virtual Site Engagement

- Check in with students via Zoom or google hangouts (ONLY WITH PERMISSION FROM SUPERVISOR)
- Attend staff and other site-related virtual meetings
- Weekly sessions via Zoom or google hangouts

Schedule Remote Supervision

• Weekly individual sessions via Zoom (if needed)

Participate in Professional Development for Practicum Students and Interns (If available, keep a certificate of completion, and create a short, written reflection, or a presentation/handout/infographic to disseminate your knowledge gained to classmates/colleagues)
